

# Theological Assessment Graph

## (or Finding your Christian Comfort Zone)

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1. Place yourself somewhere on each of three lines to the right. A value of 4 means solidly in the mainstream of that tradition. (Questions overleaf will help you determine where to place yourself if you're unsure). Values above 4 are leading toward Fundamentalism, Mythic-Morality, and Grandiose-Mysticism, respectively



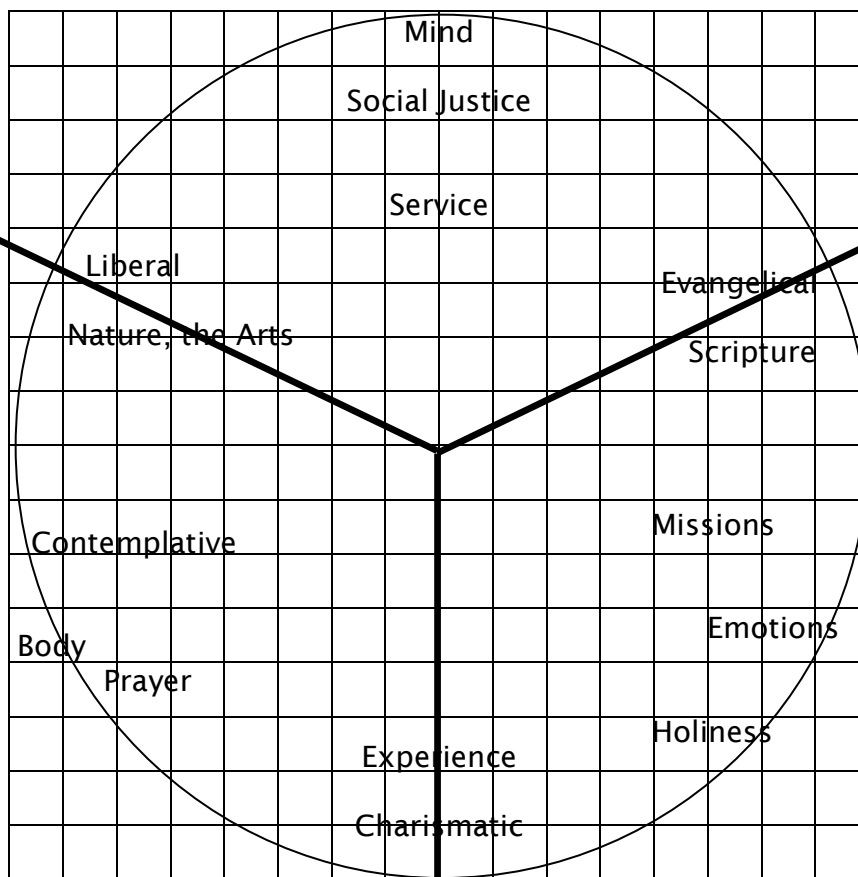
Scale: ¼ inch = 1 point. The lines on the graph are ¼ apart, so each line is worth 1 point. The radius of the circle is 8.

2. Plot your center. Start with Evangelical, move up the line ¼ inch for each point. --From there, move parallel to the Liberal line the appropriate distance. --Finally, from your new location, move directly down the graph the amount of your charismatic score. --This is your ministry center.

### 3. Determine your circle of Influence

After plotting your place on the graph, measure your distance from the center in quarters of an inch. Each ¼ is worth one point. Use the chart below to find your Circle of Influence's radius.

5. Adjust your Circle's radius. If your total score was ≤7, make an adjustment to your radius using the chart below and then draw your ministry circle. If your total score was ≥8 but ≤14, draw your ministry circle now. If your total score was ≥15, draw two circles: first a circle with the radius from step #3, then a second circle, around the very center of the chart, with the designated radius. This represents your "alienated center: the people near the center who are afraid of you."
